ABOUT CERTIFICATE IV IN EDUCATION SUPPORT

This course is suitable if you are currently working as or seeking to work as a teacher aide in a primary, secondary or special needs school or community education setting. This Nationally Recognised course consists of 17 units:

Entry Requirements

While not mandatory, you should have completed a Certificate III or higher level qualification OR have experience in education or child related employment. It is expected that students have well developed written and verbal communication skills, basic numeracy skills and basic computer operating skills. A working with children check (also known as a blue card in Qld) must be obtained prior to conducting your vocational placement. Refer back to our website for links to each State or Territory agency responsible for administering working with children checks.

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DURATION

You will generally have 2 years to complete. As a guide someone spending 8 hrs per week on assessment, could expect to complete the course in approximately 7 - 9 months. Please note that students receiving government funding/subsidies may be obligated to complete in a set time frame:

- Centrelink (education supplement): full time 53 weeks, part time 89 weeks

PRACTICAL

Students not currently working in the education support industry will be required to complete 100 hours practical placement as part of their study. You may choose to do your placement as a full time block or part time (e.g. 2 days per week). Adapt Education can arrange your placement for you or you can arrange your own. An additional 100hrs of placement may be required for school based students, students on a traineeship, Early School leavers or those that have been assessed as having limited work/life experience. This will enable more time to develop skills in a work setting. In some instances the exact number of practical placement hours will need to be negotiated between the student, the trainer and the placement person.

GOVERNMENT FUNDING

This course is approved for funding through the following agencies/programs:

- Higher Level Skills Program (eligible QLD residents only)
- Commonwealth Traineeships (for new Teacher Aide employees)
- Education Supplement (for eligible Centrelink customers)

Higher Level Skills Program

To be eligible for the Higher Level Skills subsidy you must:

- Be 15 years of age or older and no longer at school.
- Permanently reside in Queensland.
- Not hold (or be currently enrolled in) a Certificate IV or higher level qualification. This does not include qualifications completed while at secondary school or abroad.
- Be an Australian or New Zealand citizen, or Australian permanent resident (including humanitarian entrants), or a temporary resident with the necessary visa and work permits on the pathway to permanent residency.

Students approved for the Higher Level Skills subsidy will pay a student contribution fee. Concession card holders, Aboriginal or Torres Strait Islander people will receive a discount.

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STUDY MODE

Delivery and assessment of this course can be customised. Please discuss your options with Adapt to ensure that we have created the course that best suits you.

Self-paced study means that you can study at times and locations that suit you. No assessment due dates and no timetabled lectures or webinars. You can choose to study online using an interactive student portal or via correspondence with all materials posted out to you. Fast track your study or take your time – the choice is yours.

Blended study has all the perks of self-paced study with the addition of face-to-face sessions with your trainer. For some students face-to-face study increases their ability to grasp concepts and understand assessment requirements. You can book as many or as few face-to-face sessions as you like – the price in the table below is based on four face-to-face sessions.

Online or Correspondence?

The course consists of two key components – Theory and Practical. For the theory component you may opt to receive course resources by correspondence or online.

- **Online:** benefit from an easy to navigate elearning course. The online course is interactive, meaning less readings and more visually engaging resources.
- **Correspondence:** receive course resources such as textbooks and assessments in a hardcopy format. Resources are presented in a student portfolio for easy management. Assessment is provided on a USB stick.

PAYMENT

Note: fees quoted below are inclusive of all mandatory course resources. Additional fees apply if you choose to select the unit *HLTAID003 Apply first aid* as an elective unit. Please read the first aid section in this document for further details.

COURSE COMMENCEMENT

Upon receipt of your enrolment form an Adapt Education staff member will contact you to discuss: your elective units of study, your practical placement preferences, and a suitable course commencement and induction date.

On receipt of your upfront payment and signed course documentation:

- RPL students will receive a kit for the selected course units
- Online students will be emailed with instructions, login details and password
- Correspondence students will receive a course portfolio

Course Induction

All Adapt Education students will receive a course induction. Inductions may be completed face-to-face, on Skype, or over the phone. During your induction, your trainer will: take time to explain how to navigate your course resources and assessments; and provide you with some guidance on the depth and content expected in some of the different assessments.

COMPLETING YOUR ASSESSMENT

Your assessment consists of two key areas:

Theory assessment that may include: text activities, written questions, case studies, projects, evidence portfolios. Delivery and assessment of this course can be customised. Please discuss your options with Adapt to ensure that we have created the course that best suits you.

Practical assessment that includes demonstration of your skills in the workplace. Recorded as observations by your supervisor, practical placement person or trainer.

STUDENT SUPPORT

Regardless of the study mode you select, every student studying with Adapt has unlimited access to their trainer through phone, email, instant messaging and Skype contact. You may send your trainer drafts for feedback and comments. Each trainer has significant industry experience and will prove to be a valuable support network for you throughout the course.

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FIRST AID

Apart from being a crucial life skill, having up-to-date First Aid certification can improve your employability. You have the option of selecting HLTAID003 Provide first aid as an elective unit within this course. Note: selecting this unit is not mandatory. Adapt Education delivers this unit at select venues around Brisbane. Please contact us to find out upcoming course dates and venues. Alternatively, you are able to complete the first aid course with any provider in Australia. Simply present your certificate to us on completion and we will credit the unit towards your Education Support course.

Some important points to consider if selecting HLTAID003 Provide first aid as an elective:

- The cost of the first aid unit is not included in Adapt Education's course fee. You will need to pay the listed course fee to your selected first aid provider.
- Ensure that you are booking into a first aid course that includes the nationally recognised unit HLTAID003 Provide First Aid.
- Upon receipt of your certificate, please forward a copy to Adapt for our records.
- If you have previously completed HLTAID003 within the last 3 years you may present your certificate to Adapt for a Credit Transfer.

Recommended recertification period

Once you have achieved your first aid competency, refresher training in CPR should be undertaken annually, and all other first aid qualifications should be renewed every three years.

COURSE COMPLETION

On successful completion of all course requirements you will be issued a Nationally Recognised Certificate IV in Education Support. All students completing or discontinuing their studies will be required to complete a student survey.
